The National Collegiate Wrestling Championships and Convention will attract some of the best college athletes in the country from over 160 major Universities like Georgia, Iowa State, Yale, and UCLA to smaller Colleges like Apprentice and Grays Harbor. 460 male and 120 female athletes will qualify to make the trip to Nationals culled from 8 Conference Championships held in Pennsylvania, Virginia, Florida, Texas, Michigan, California, Washington and New Hampshire in February.

The NCWA National Convention attracts Coaches, Trainers, Wrestling Alumni, Wrestling Sports Writers and various Sport Vendors. Biding for the National Collegiate Wrestling Championships

For a city to host the National Collegiate Wrestling Championships we prefer they be within a 50 mile radius of a current NCWA member institution capable of assisting in hosting the event. (The NCWA is generally able to establish a program for your city to become eligible within 6 to 8 months)

**Bid's are due to the NCWA no later than 7 months prior to the start of the Championships for which the bid is to be considered. Bids may be turned in for consideration as much as 18 months prior to the Championship for which the bid is to be considered.

(For 2023 - bids are accepted through July 1st 2022) **

No Bid Fee required for bid to be reviewed by the NCWA National Event Committee.

Winning the Bid - Should your City win the bid the City/ CVB/Chamber should be prepared to handle:

- 1. Venue & facility costs described above including medical, & facility Personnel
- 2. Plan for local media coverage prior and during the event (\$10,000 local advertising budget).
- 3. 18 Complimentary hotel rooms throughout the event for Officials and staff
- 4. 20 Officials selected by the NCWA to be paid \$750 each by the city/CVB.
- 5. Hospitality Room with beverages and 6 meals over 3 days for event staff & Officials.

 The above minimum concessions are required for a bid to be given serious consideration by NCWA Tournament Committee.

<u>Printing & Advertising</u>: The CVB / Chamber of Commerce will be asked to pay for the print costs of the National Collegiate Wrestling Championships Program. The CVB may secure local print advertising to cover the cost of the printing the program and brackets. Profit on ads above print costs on program will become the property of the CVB or the local host college that solicited the advertising.

<u>Ticketing & Gate Receipts</u>: The NCWA shall determine event ticket prices. The host City / University shall retain all local gate receipts to help offset event expenses. It is expected that retaining these receipts will encourage the local organizing body to heavily promote the event to increase their profit. NCWA reserves the right to sell and retain funds on advance ticketing through its member institutions and on the NCWA Website.

<u>Event Housing:</u> The NCWA does NOT typically use third party Housing Bureau / Agents. NCWA will handle all hotel negotiations, Booking of all rooms, collection of any agreed upon rebates, and the collection of accurate housing data.

Room Uptake: Conventioneers should begin arriving two days before the Tournament start and most will depart the day after the conclusion of festivities. Competing Teams will generally arrive a day in advance of the actual competition day.
